## Gramática: Direct Object Pronouns

**Direct object pronouns** can be used to replace **direct object nouns**.

Here's how:

	Singular	Plural	
	<b>me</b> me	<b>nos</b> us	
	<b>te</b> you (familiar)	<b>os</b> you (familiar)	
masculine →	<b>lo</b> you (formal), him, it	<b>los</b> you, them	← masculine

The **direct object noun** is placed after the **conjugated verb**.

The **direct object pronoun** is placed directly before the **conjugated verb**.

la (her, it - fem)	las (them - fem)

Note: The "os" pronoun is generally used in Spain and some Latin American regions. In most of Latin America, "los" and "las" are used for both formal and informal plural "you."

## Placement of Direct Object Pronouns

Attached to conjugated verb: \_Lo veo.\_ (I see him.) \_La conozco.\_ (I know her.)

Before conjugated verb (infinitive or gerund): \_Quiero verla.\_ (I want to see her.) \_Estoy leyendolo.\_ (I am reading it.)

## Pronoun Agreement: Gender and Number

Accuracy requires careful attention to gender and number agreement. The pronoun must match the gender (masculine or feminine) and number (singular or plural) of the noun it replaces. For example:

Correct: \_Veo al perro. Lo veo.\_ (I see the dog. I see him.)

Incorrect: \_Veo a la perra. Lo veo.\_ (I see the female dog. I see him.) - should be: \_La veo.\_

## Common Mistakes and How to Avoid Them

Even experienced learners can stumble with direct object pronouns. Here are some common pitfalls:

Incorrect pronoun selection: Carefully consider the gender and number of the noun being replaced.
