

At the end of that year, I could not believe I'd finally accomplished this challenge of

reading Genesis through Revelation. So what next—just be done with it? I decided to do it again the next year, and the next, and the next... I believe God has a sense of humor and turned me into the Forrest Gump of Bible reading. (Remember how he kept running back-and-forth across the country?) I mentioned we started with about 450 in our Facebook group the first year and now there are over 1500. This year, I decided to put the devotionals in book form so readers would have the option to join me online or by paperback.
