Complications of fractures include problems associated with immobility (muscle atrophy, joint contracture, pressure sores), growth problems (in children), infection, shock, venous stasis and thromboembolism, pulmonary emboli and fat emboli, and bone	After 8 hours of nursing intervention the patient will regain or maintain mobility at the highest possible level.
