It weaves thematic threads of love, faith, and family into a candid assault on the hypocrisy of the so-called "land of the free", insisting on the inequality implicit to American society. "You were born where you were born and faced the future that you faced", Baldwin writes to his nephew, "because you were black and for no other reason." His profound sense of injustice is matched by a robust belief in "monumental dignity", in patience, empathy, and the possibility of transforming America into "what America must become".
