Situation: The National School Lunch Program reimburses schools for each meal sold to students. Schools get \$2.50 to \$3 for free and reduced-price meals and about 30 cents for full-price meals. Some schools serve mostly meals free or reduced-price meals. Others serve mostly full-price meals, so they receive less money. Schools in the program must produce enough food to offer a meal to every student who wants one.

Opportunity: To continue being reimbursed, schools must follow new guidelines to make lunches healthier. These guidelines limit sugar and fatty foods while increasing fruits, vegetables, and whole grains. Situation: During an economic downturn or recession, more people become unemployed. Most states offer unemployment benefits for workers who are laid off. These benefits are funded by both state and federal taxes that employers pay. Usually, only people who lost a full-time job can get benefits, the benefits end after a period of time. Today's employers often cut costs by hiring people to work just under the number of hours required to be full time.

Opportunity: The federal government is offering an extra \$7 billion to support state unemployment programs. States can receive their share of the money by covering part-time workers and those who quit their jobs because of a family situation like domestic violence or a relative's illness. Benefits must also continue as long as the unemployed person is enrolled in job training.

Once noted as the organizer of victory by Winston Churchill for his leadership of the Allied victory in World War II, Marshall served as the United States Army Chief of Staff during the war and as the chief military adviser to President Franklin D. Roosevelt. As Secretary of State, his name was given to the Marshall Plan, for which he was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1953. He drafted this manuscript while he was in Washington, D.C., between 1919 and 1924 as aide-de-camp to General of the Armies John J. Pershing. However, given the growing bitterness of the memoirs wars of the period he decided against publication, and the draft sat unused until the 1970s when Marshall's step-daughter and her husband decided to publish it.
